On Sept. 2-3, our parish will celebrate its 55th anniversary. Founded in 1962, the parish was named in honor of the patron saint of parish priests. Jean-Baptiste-Marie Vianney was ordained in 1805 and became the parish priest of Ars, a remote French hamlet not far from the town of Lyon. Within a short time, his reputation as a confessor became well known, and people began coming to him from nearby villages, all parts of France and other countries. During the last 10 years of his life, he spent from 16 to 18 hours a day in the confessional. He died in 1859 was canonized in 1925 and declared the patron saint of parish priests in 1929 by Pope Pius XI. May St. John Vianney pray for our priests, pray for us, and pray for the mission of our parish. Amen. (Reported by Earl Walker)
