Our Mass schedule is published in the Sunday bulletins of other Maui Catholic Churches as well as in the religion section of The Maui News. (In October, a lady from Makawao came to Mass because her sister in Alaska told her about the Mass announcement she had seen in the online edition of The Maui News!) Our Mass schedule remains as follows: Whenever there is a fifth Sunday in any given month (usually twice a year), Mass is celebrated at noon, followed by fellowship and a pot-luck meal, after which the faithful begin their long journey home, usually with the promise of "see you next time." We are ever so grateful of Father Arwin's dedication to accommodate this Mass amid his busy holiday schedule. Father Arwin also celebrates Mass at St. Peter Mission at Puuiki and St. Paul Mission in Kipahulu, thus giving him the responsibility of three missions in addition to St. Mary Church in Hana. Additionally, driving 18 miles (one way), conditions can be quite hazardous. Part of the journey is on un-













paved and rutted gravel roadways, subject to landslides, rock falls, stream overflow and washouts. Our April 2017 Mass was cancelled at the last minute when the roads were washed out by heavy rains on both the "Hana-side" and the "Kula-side." Again, we are very appreciative of Father Arwin's efforts to come to our remote and isolated location to celebrate Mass where many of us have our family roots. (Reported by Marvy
